As ever this edition is packed full of interesting stories, great articles and wonderful photographs.


You will also find many of our usual features. We have a report from our new National TAG Chairperson and lots of news from the Regional Advisory

ANNUAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARD


To recognise all the great work that people throughout KEY are doing we launched our annual Now You're Talking Achievment Award.



Jean also saves up her coppers and donates them to the local Cat and Dog Home. As well as this she also sponsers a little girl in Kenya.




Isobel Davidson from Thurso is a keen accordion player. She has also written an ode for us about a worker she is very fond of...



There was also a very nice bar which served delicious food. I spent a lovely day on the steam train to Boness and sailed along Lake


Windermere to Keswick.

Hitting The Headlines...






